(Victorian Wreath of Wildflowers)

An All-Day Workshop

Shape fabric and ribbons into colorful wildflowers that will bloom into a Victorian wreath on a 12-inch quilt block. Learn to make a silk satin ribbon pansy, a wild rose, yellow Verbana, ruched Hepatica with rolled centers and gathered heart leaves all on silk satin cording. Simple hand gathering stitches that do not have to be perfect and will not show will be used. Broderie Perse for applique leaves will be learned. Add borders and this album block can be made into a wallhanging or even dress up the back of a vest.

All Skill Levels, Hand work

Kit is \$20 and includes instructions and patterns, all fabrics, ribbons, beads, silk cording, crinoline, needles and a batting covered working board to lay out your block as you work.

Supplies to bring: If you have a favorite background fabric for the block, in a any light color like pale green, beige or cream, whatever, bring that as well. If you have fabric with leaves, vines, butterflies, birds, or seed pods printed on it, please bring that. Also bring, polyester thread in medium gray/taupe and a variety of flower colors, chalk marker, chalk pouncer, regular and paper scissors, a measure, pins, extra needles, needle threader, a pincushion and extra magnification if you use it.
