

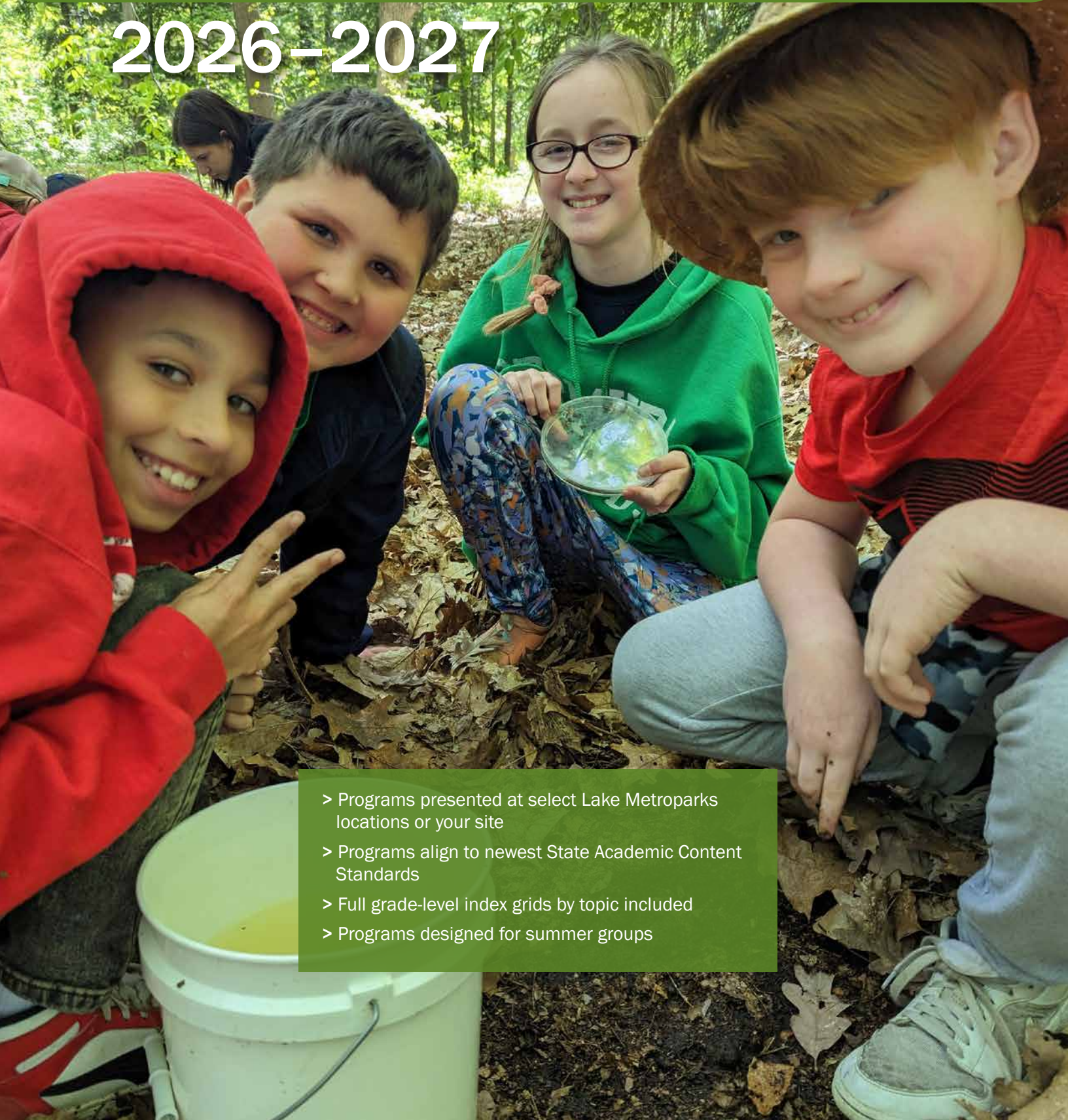

Summer Programs

We are excited to offer new programming designed for camps, day cares and other summer groups that create an atmosphere of fun and excitement for combined ages preschool to grade 5.

Scheduling

Please schedule at least **two weeks** in advance. Call between 8 am and 4:30 pm weekdays. To schedule a program, please call 440-358-7275. Farmpark programs may be scheduled by calling 440-256-2122.

Be prepared with first and second choices of dates and times and have the "Registration Checklist" information (on back cover) ready when you call. Spring and fall dates fill well in advance!

In order to maximize your visit to Lake Metroparks, please confirm your arrival and departure times with your transportation department several days before your visit.

Fees: programs at our parks

- Program fees are \$7 per student participant (\$8 for Pizza Farm program with pizza sample; \$9 for StarLab programs), \$70 minimum unless otherwise noted.
- Minimum of ten students for any program; inquire about maximums or scheduling back-to-back programs.
- For Farmpark educational programs that happen on Lake County Free days, free admission will not apply to school or recreation bookings.
- Farmpark members may not use their membership to get in free for an educational program.
- One adult admitted free for every ten students in grades K-12. One adult admitted free for every five preschool and kindergarten students. Additional adults are charged the student program fee. Please mention if you plan to bring a student aide when you register.
- Teachers or group leaders are required to accompany the group.
- One aide admitted free for each participant with disabilities.
- Farmpark payment options include VISA, Mastercard, Discover, cash, check or PO

Fees: programs at your school

- Assembly programs are \$210 for the first presentation and \$150 for each additional presentation the same day at the same location unless otherwise noted.
- Assembly programs are for groups of 30 or more students.
- All non-assembly outreach programs are \$7 per student participant (\$9 for StarLab programs), \$70 minimum unless otherwise noted. Inquire about scheduling back-to-back programs when you call.
- Programs that require the presenter to travel outside Lake County are charged an additional \$1.50/mile fee.

Credit card and check are accepted—or an invoice can be sent.

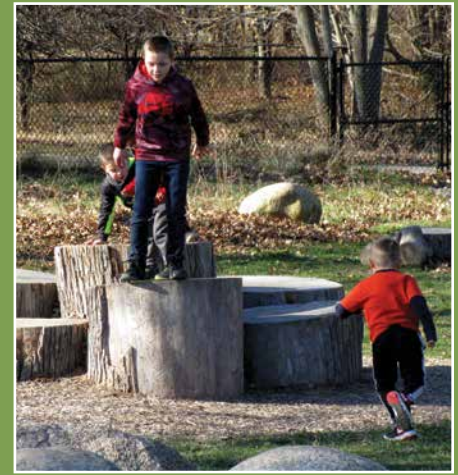

Make time for play during your visit to the parks!

During your free time at Farmpark, visit the farm-themed playground in **Showman's Circle**. The playground has slides, large climb-on animals and an area to roam and explore. There is also a small pavilion where you can relax in the shade.

Adventure Play at Jordan Creek Park is designed for kids ages 7 and older and has elements and obstacles that challenge balance and climbing ability. You will find two ziplines to zoom across, a slackline forest, lookout towers connected by a 30-foot rope bridge, and the impressive 15-foot-tall Noble Wall to traverse across. At **Nature Play** at Penitentiary Glen Reservation, kids can navigate through an acre of green landscape with logs to climb on, tunnels to crawl through and a garden to tend to. Kids are encouraged to chart their own course of adventure through this outdoor play maze.

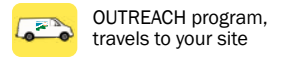

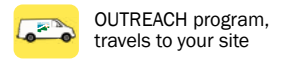

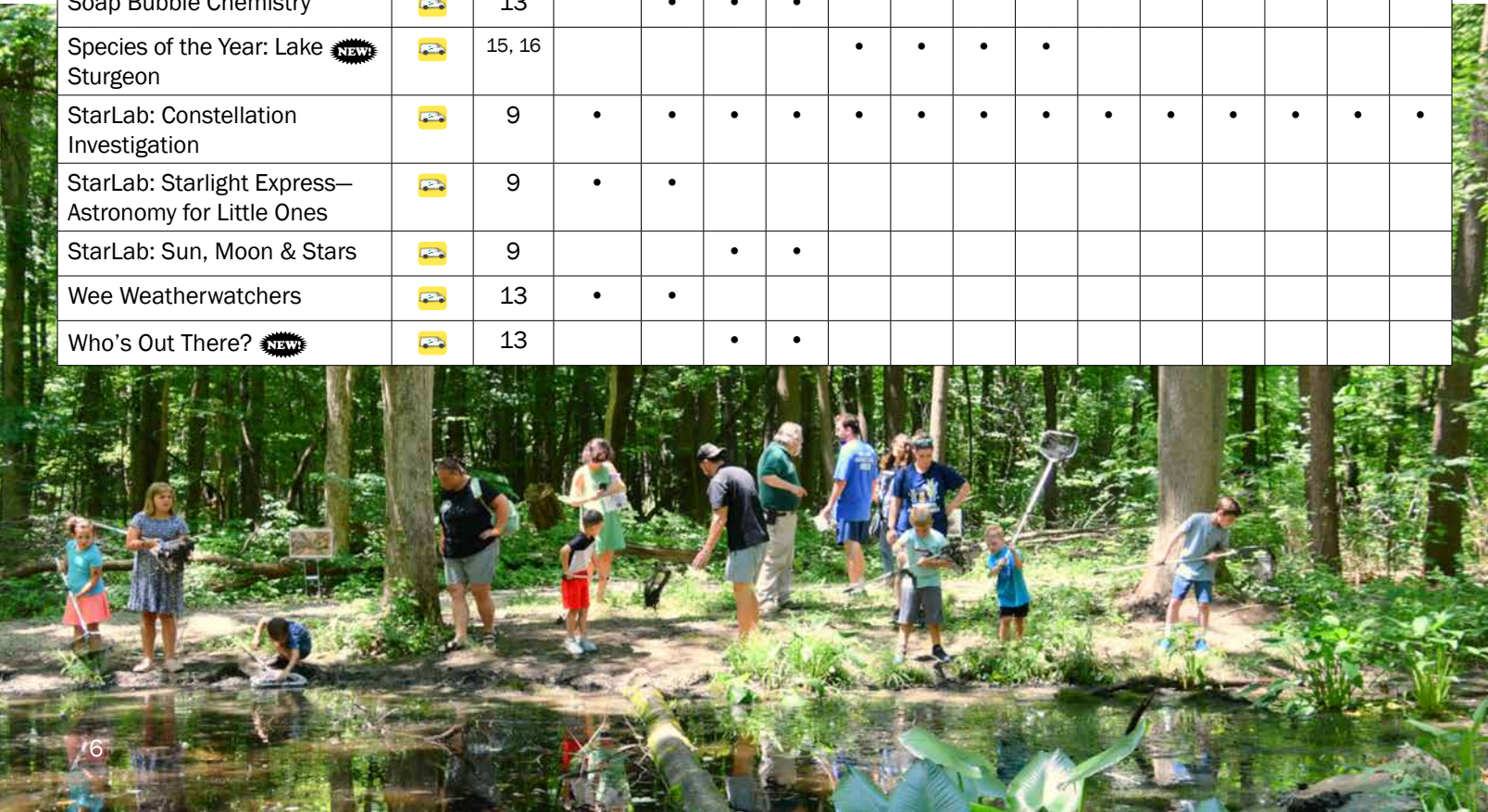

Archery Adventure *Grades 1–5*

1 hour • Fee: \$7

Have you ever shot a bow and arrow before? Now is your chance! Students learn the proper safety of the bow and arrow, then have a chance to shoot several rounds on the range and give it their best shot!

Eco Protectors *Grades 1–5* 🚗

1 hour • Fee: \$7

Learn how you can become a protector of our natural environment by following the Leave No Trace philosophy. Through hands-on activities, program participants learn the seven principles of Leave No Trace and how to incorporate them into their daily lives as they enjoy the parks.

Fishing Adventure *Preschool–Grade 5*

1 hour • Fee: \$7

Insect Investigators *Preschool–Grade 5* 🚗

1 hour • Fee: \$7

Did you know that some of the tiniest creatures on Earth play the biggest roles in maintaining the planet's health? Insects are not just buzzing around, they are amazing pollinators and indicators of ecosystem health. Insects like bees, butterflies, and beetles are responsible for pollinating a staggering 75 percent of the crops we rely on for food. Learn the fascinating process of insect pollination, how certain insect species can reveal the state of the natural world, and simple actions you can take to protect these creatures.

Kayak Adventure *Kindergarten–Grade 5*

1 hour • Fee: \$7

Soap Bubble Chemistry *Preschool–Grade 5* 🚗

After the introduction, each grade has the chance to visit stations designed to help them understand the adaptations of eagles, their conservation and the threats that still exist to their population. What does the night sky have to offer? Come explore all things astronomy with the Digital StarLab! Students take part in a cutting-edge digital experience while traveling through the universe to investigate stars, planets, galaxies and so much more. All programs align to Ohio's Learning Standards. Don't see a topic that you are interested in? Lake Metroparks is happy to develop a custom program to fit your needs. The StarLab is portable and can travel to your school; all you need is a room 14.5 feet tall and 27 feet x 27 feet. Fee is \$9 per student participant.

StarLab: Constellation Investigation

All grades • 1 hour • Fee: \$9

KEYWORDS Sun, moon, stars

The night sky has been the inspiration for groups of people the world over to tell stories about the stars. What are constellations? Are they just fun stories? Complete your own constellation investigation as we explore how the Earth's movement causes day and night and how it moves in space around the sun.

StarLab: Sun, Moon & Stars Grades 1 & 2

1.5 hours • Fee: \$9

KEYWORDS Daily changes

Kayak Adventure *All grades*

1 hour • Fee: \$7 **KEYWORDS** Water safety, lifetime physical activity

Snowshoe Adventure *All grades*

1 hour • Fee: \$7 **KEYWORDS** Lifetime physical activity

Snowshoeing has been around for thousands of years. It started as a way to get around to hunt or gather food, but now it's for fun! Wear your own outdoor winter boots (snowshoes fit over them). We supply the instruction and snowshoes. Program is specialized for each grade level.

Springtime on the Farm *All grades*

2 hours or more • Fee: \$7 • April–May **KEYWORDS** Planting, farm animals

Animals & People *Grade 2*

2.5 hours • Fee: \$7 • mid-Oct.–mid-March

KEYWORDS Food web, energy

Second graders investigate the farm and gather pieces to create a food web. Students discover how people and animals depend on each other for food and shelter. At the conclusion, magnetic pieces are used to illustrate the interdependence of life. To register for this program, call 440-256-2122.

KEYWORDS Lifetime physical activity

Changes in Motion *Grades 1–2*

1.5 hours • Fee: \$7

KEYWORDS Force, friction, speed

If you want anything to move, you have to give it a push or pull. Observe and demonstrate Newton's laws of motion and gravity through activities using forces on wheels and rockets. Students design stomp rockets to launch to demonstrate force and gravity.

Farm Animals & Me *Grade 1*

2.5 hours • Fee: \$7 • mid-Oct.–mid-March

KEYWORDS Animal needs, animal products

Examine the basic needs of farm animals and investigate how much animals eat each day. See how horseshoes are made. Students collect products and identify the animals that produce them. During a closing activity, students analyze their findings by creating a pictograph of farm animals' food needs. To register for this program, call 440-256-2122.
